COLOUR CODE

In terms of statutory Instrument 39 of 2013 of the Road Traffic Act number 11 of 2002, all Mini Buses and Taxis are to be rebranded effective 31st August 2013.

CONDITIONS:

- 1. All Passenger Public Service Vehicles will be painted with high intensive reflective ribbon, which shall be ten centimetres in width, pasted from the front to the rear on the midsection of both sides of the vehicles
- 2. Taxis will further be fitted with an illuminating lamp and display the designated taxi fleet code
- 3. Operators who own a fleet of more than 30 vehicles may apply to the Director of the Road Transport and Safety Agency (RTSA) to be exempted from the provisions of this regulation
- 4. Luxury coaches will be exempted from the above provisions of colour specification.
- 5. For all passenger public service vehicles that are already painted in the colour blue code, they will be given amnesty or grace period of <u>one year to migrate to the</u> new colour code from date of effect of the <u>new regulation</u>.
- 6. A passenger public service vehicle shall be registered with the RTSA and shall be issued with a fleet code by the Director which shall be clearly inscribed on the front doors of the vehicle in visible letters in a font of two centimeters width and ten centimeters in height.
