The Road Traffic (Demerit Point System) Regulations, 2024

IN EXERCISE of the powers contained in section 233 of the Road Traffic Act, 2002, the following Regulations are made:

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Demerit Point System) Regulations, 2024, and shall come into operation on the expiration of one hundred and eighty days from the date on which they are published in the *Gazette*.

Title and Commencement

2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

Interpretation

- "accumulated demerit points" means the total demerit points in a person's record acquired as a result of offences committed within a period of two years, less any points deducted for that period;
- "Constitutional office holder" has the meaning assigned to the words in the Constitution;

- "court" means the Subordinate Court or the High Court;
- "demerit point" has the meaning assigned to the words in Act;
- "driving licence" means a licence issued under the Act or its equivalent, authorising a person to drive a motor vehicle in the Republic;

Accumulated demerit points

4. (1) A person is permitted to incur a maximum number of twelve demerit points.

- (2) Subject to subregulation (1), where a person accumulates demerit points above the allowable maximum, the driving licence of that person shall be suspended for a period that is equal in months to the number of demerit points by which the maximum number is exceeded, multiplied by three.
- (3) The Director shall send a notice, by text message or other means that the Director may determine, to a person who has incurred demerits points above the allowable maximum referred to under subregulation (1)—
 - (a) informing the person of the suspension of the driving licence and the period thereof;
 - (b) informing the person, of that person's disqualification from obtaining another driving licence during the period of suspension; and
 - (c) directing the person to surrender the driving licence within fourteen days of the notice, to the Director or the licensing officer in the district where the person resides.

(4) A person who—

- (a) drives or operates a motor vehicle during the period of suspension commits an offence and is liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding one hundred thousand penalty units or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year, or to both;
- (b) fails to surrender a driving licence to the Director after being directed to do so under subregulation (3) (c) commits an offence and is liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding one thousand penalty units; or
- (c) applies for a driving licence during the period of suspension, commits an offence and is liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding one thousand penalty units.
- (5) A police officer or road traffic inspector shall, in addition to the penalty specified under subregulation (4)(b), seize a suspended driving licence that is not surrendered within the period specified under subregulation (3)(c).
- (6) Subject to subregulation (2), where a driving licence is not surrendered to the Director or licensing officer as provided under subregulation (3), the period of suspension shall run from the date of renewal of the driving licence, in which case, the Director shall retain the renewed driving licence until the period of suspension is served.

(7) A holder of a driving licence who serves the full term of the period of suspension referred to under this regulation, may apply to the Director for the release of the driving licence.

Subject to subregulation (7), the Director shall, where the Director releases a driving licence on application made under subregulation (7), reduce the demerit points for the driving licence involved to zero.

6. (1) The Director shall maintain a register of demerit points. (2) A person who intends to obtain a copy of the register

referred to under subregulation (1), shall apply to the Director for a copy of the register, on payment of a fee set out in the Road Traffic (Fees) Regulations, 2021.

Despite subregulation (1), a fee shall not be paid if the person to whom copies are supplied is a public officer, State officer, Constitutional office holder, judge, judicial officer or a local authority

acting in an official capacity.
